



The Emily Krzyzewski Center, a non-profit organization in Durham, North Carolina, was established in 2006 and named in honor of Coach Mike Krzyzewski's mother. The Emily K Center implements three *K to College* programs, a series of year-round, out-of-school initiatives that serve academically-focused students from low-income backgrounds. In addition, the Center enhances the impact of local organizations by serving as a home and resource for nonprofits, schools, and community groups.

Facility Partnerships

The Emily K Center is proud to be a part of the vibrant Durham community. We partner with almost 70 organizations annually who utilize the Center's multipurpose rooms, gymnasium, and stage to convene, learn, and grow. Each partnership is unique. Some Facility Partners meet here weekly to run their own programs, while others hold quarterly meetings or host a larger annual event.

Establishing Partnerships

In addition to ongoing established partnerships, each year we look forward to building new partnerships with organizations who drive positive impact in our city and state. Organizations interested in becoming Facility Partners complete the following process:

- I. *Initial Inquiries* – Partner provides an overview of their organization, space needs, proposed days and times, and contact information.
- II. *Exploration Meeting* – The Center and Partner meet to discuss program details, logistics, availability, and rentals or other associated costs. The Partner may also tour the facility.
- III. *Partnership Agreement* – The Partner completes necessary paperwork outlining the agreement and signs any required documents.
- IV. *Partnership Implementation* – The Center and Partner meet periodically to ensure partnerships are successful and to share ideas and resources.

Facility Partnership Outcomes

We recognize that good work and strong partnerships make Durham a caring and supportive place to live. Each partnership allows both organizations to complement each other in different ways, ultimately enabling the Center to do far more than we can do alone.

- 68 Facility Partners ran programs, hosted events, or held meetings at the Center last year; 34 were new partnerships.
- In partnering with the Center, 96% of Facility Partner organizations were able to increase the number of community members they served.
- In a typical week, Facility Partners used the building for an average of 67 hours and served more than 1,400 people.
- The Center provided space for free or at discount to 94% of partners, saving these organization \$218,975 in rental fees.

Facility: The 29,000 square foot Emily K Center houses seven multi-purpose rooms, a dividable gym, and a stage that accommodates our Facility Partners in academic and leadership programming, community and business meetings, workshops, and special events.
